homes built to house Kitarini Primary School teachers



As the number of students increase, the need for more teachers becomes urgent. By building new teacher housing, the government will assign more teachers to the school, improving the teacherstudent ratio and education quality.

372.800 meals for Kitarini Primary School students



Each school day, 900 students receive breakfast and lunch. The meals ensure the parents send their kids to school, the kids arrive on time and stay all day, and the kids are motivated and alert to learn.

gemology & gem faceting program graduates



In 2022, eight students received scholarships and graduated the 5-month program at the **Arusha Gemological & Gem Faceting School.** Graduates are equipped to enter the growing gem faceting workforce in Fast Africa.

What we're Celebrating

of <u>Mwatate students</u> attend Secondary School



For the 4th year in a row, the 18 kids of the Mwatate Children's Home eligible to attend secondary school (equivalent to US middle school and high school) were awarded scholarships. Approximately half of East African children attend secondary school, and even fewer girls.

4 Miner Toolkits delivered to-date



According to World Bank and other studies, 70%-80% of East African colored gemstone miners are artisanal, small-scale miners. Often, they use old farming tools to mine. We are equipping them for safety and success with each \$125 Miner Toolkit, customized to their needs.

New Initiatives in 2023

Early Childhood Education Support

The goal of this initiative at Kitarini Primary School is to bring long-term solutions to support early childhood development. This initiative will provide teacher training and establish curriculum to support critical thinking and problem solving, creativity and imaginative play, and fine motor skills.

Student receives essential early developmental support Approx. 150 students annually

Renovate a Kitarini Primary School classroom: Four classrooms

College Scholarship Program

Attending college exceeds the financial capacity for many families, especially those in small scale mining. The scholarship program will provide opportunities for children of mining communities to attend a domestic college for 2 to 3 years, depending on the student's field of study. This initiative is available to past graduates of Kitarini Primary School and Mwatate Children's Home students. Below are example fields of study.

\$1,600 A child from a mining area attends college to become a teacher (total for 2 years)

\$6,600 A child from a mining area attends college to become a doctor (total for 3 years)

Career Fair

Coordinated with Gem Legacy's efforts to provide opportunities for higher education, we want to encourage apprenticeships, vocational training, and college. We will host Annual Career Fairs to inspire students to understand their unique skills and explore potential careers and passions. Career Fairs will be available to students from all of Gem Legacy's Community Development initiatives, with presentations from the local workforce.

Silicosis Prevention Initiative Update

Being fiscally responsible for the funds entrusted to our care is at the core of Gem Legacy's foundation. Our goal is to ensure that every dollar donated by our partners is used to maximum effect. To that end, Gem Legacy has invested in air quality testing conducted by occupational health experts to accurately understand the silica levels underground and the best options to protect the miners and their lungs from silicosis.

The air samples are currently being tested by laboratory in the US and, based on the extrapolated data, Gem Legacy will be able to ensure that the personal protective equipment selected will result in the maximum protection to Tanzanite mines.


